LIVONIA CITY COUNCIL 2022-2023 COMMITTEES

CAPITAL OUTLAY AND INFRASTRUCTURE

The Committee on Capital Outlay and Infrastructure will review issues related to City-owned structures and buildings or other proposed major capital projects. City roads and rights-of-way, sewer infrastructure, utilities, refuse recovery and recycling in the city.

FINANCE AND BUDGET

The Committee on Finance and Budget will review issues related to the City budget, City investments, and insurance.

LAW AND EDUCATION

The Committee on Law and Education will review issues related to county, state, and federal legislation and other regulations affecting the City and will serve as a liaison with county, state and federal officials, as well as public and private schools and institutions of higher education, on matters of interest to the City. The committee will also be tasked with periodic review of City ordinances for opportunities to revise or modernize provisions which may be out-of-date due to changes in technology and society.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, STRATEGIC PLANNING, AND TECHNOLOGY

The Committee of Economic Development, Strategic Planning, and Technology will review issues related to economic development, redevelopment and repurposing, the City's master plan, information technology and modernization of city services, and will work with local businesses and business groups to promote economic development and growth within the City.

PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENT

The Committee on Public Safety, Health, and Environment will review issues related to City police and fire services, public health, and environmental issues and will serve as a liaison with county, state, and federal public health officials, as well as local healthcare service providers, on matters of interest to the City.

SENIOR CITIZENS AND FAMILIES

The Committee on Senior Citizens and Families will review issues related to senior housing, the Livonia Senior Center, the Livonia Community Recreation Center, recreation opportunities, City parks, public transportation, arts and culture, faith-based initiatives, and other issues related to quality of life in the City.
