

MINUTES OF THE ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED FIFTY FIFTH**REGULAR MEETING OCTOBER 17, 2022**

On October 17, 2022, the above meeting was held at the City Hall, 33000 Civic Center Drive, Livonia, Michigan, and was called to order by the President of the Council at 7:00 p.m. Councilmember Donovic led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll was called with the following result: Rob Donovic, Scott Morgan, Brandon McCullough, Kathleen McIntyre, Laura Toy, Scott Bahr and Jim Jolly. Absent: None.

Elected and appointed officials present: Paul Bernier, City Attorney; Susan M. Nash, City Clerk; Sara Kasproicz, Program Supervisor of Council Office; LaShawn Thomas, Director of Government Affairs; Mark Taormina, Director of Planning and Economic Development; and Todd Zilincik, City Engineer.

On a motion by Councilmember McCullough, seconded by Vice President Toy and unanimously adopted, it was:

During Audience Communication, Lori Shuk, 32956 Grennada Street, addressed Council in favor of Proposal 3 on the November General Election ballot.

Darrell Smith, 14066 Brookfield, addressed Council regarding bus rides through the Smart Flex Program, indicating that Livonia does not participate. He also spoke about ridding society of hate.

Jim Taylor, 10128 Hix Road, addressed Council to express traffic concerns on Ann Arbor Trail, specifically high-speed traffic, and overweight vehicles. He also voiced his opposition to Proposal 3 on the November General Election ballot.

Councilmember McIntyre spoke about the Livonia Police Department's unveiling of a pink patrol car to promote Breast Cancer Awareness. She indicated this is a great way to help remind the public about annual screenings and early detection. She also announced that LPD is raising funds through Breast Cancer Awareness bracelets.

Councilmember McIntyre spoke about a recent tragic accident and encouraged motorists in need of assistance to get their vehicles off to the side of the road and remain inside of the vehicle until help arrives.

Councilmember McIntyre announced the Livonia Community Foundation's annual fundraiser, Bubbles and Bourbon, to be held on Thursday, October 27, 2022, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. at One Under. Tickets can be purchased directly from the Livonia Community Foundation, the Livonia Chamber of Commerce or online.

Councilmember Donovic thanked DPW for their recent Open House and indicated it was an eye-opening experience as to how the City's new building can keep vehicles and equipment sheltered from the weather which will ultimately increase the life span.

Councilmember Donovic thanked LPD for the Faith and Blue event and stated that Livonia has the best and most professional officers and is one of the best Police Departments in Michigan.

President Jolly announced the Economic Development Strategic Planning and Technology Committee will be meeting on Wednesday, October 19, 2022, to discuss the Greenmead Master Plan and the redevelopment of Plymouth Road.

President Jolly announced there will be a Committee of the Whole meeting on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, to discuss the NDO and ways to allow organizations within Livonia to express themselves.

President Jolly announced the Citizen's Advisory Committee meeting will be held on Thursday, November 3, 2022, to discuss the 2023 Roads Program.

#314-22 RESOLVED, that having considered the report and recommendation of the Finance and Budget Committee, dated September 21, 2022, submitted pursuant to Council Resolution 263-22, the Council does hereby refer the subject matter of long-term capital needs of the City's aging water and sewer infrastructure to the Capital Outlay & Infrastructure Committee for its report and recommendation.

A communication from the Director of Finance, dated September 23, 2022, approved for submission by the Mayor, regarding Response to FY 2022-2023 Council Budget Questions, was received and placed on file for the information of the Council.

The City of Livonia Preliminary Budget Documents for Fiscal Year 2022-2023, received September 15, 2022, was received and placed on file for the information of the Council.

The Supplement to Preliminary Budget 2022-2023 Personnel Worksheets, received on September 15, 2022, was received and placed on file for the information of the council.

On a motion by Councilmember Bahr, seconded by Councilmember McCullough and unanimously adopted, it was:

Council approval is required for any modification to the amounts shown below. All proceedings on said Budget are hereby approved as being in full conformance with the City Charter, a public hearing having been held on October 3, 2022, after proper notice being published in the Livonia Observer and Eccentric, the official newspaper of the City, on September 18, 2022, and provided further that the City Clerk shall publish or cause to be published this resolution together with a summary of said Budget as adopted herein, together with the minutes of this meeting.

On a motion by Councilmember Bahr, seconded by Councilmember McCullough and unanimously adopted, it was:

#316-22 RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 5, Chapter VII and Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, the Council does hereby establish a tax levy of 3.9709 mills, of the taxable valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the city of Livonia for the next fiscal year commencing December 1, 2022, and ending November 30, 2023, and in addition to the above amount which is authorized to be levied for general purposes by the charter of the city of Livonia:

(a) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .7939 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for police protection and law enforcement personnel, equipment, supplies and facilities of the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(b) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of 1.1911 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for fire, police and snow removal personnel, equipment, supplies and facilities of the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(c) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of 1.6689 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for police and fire personnel and support costs in the City of Livonia, in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(d) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .7939 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for library services, supplies and facilities in the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(e) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .0105 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to the provisions of Act 359 of the Public Acts of 1925, for the purpose of advertising, exploiting and making known the industrial and commercial advantages of the City of Livonia and to establish projects for the purpose of encouraging immigration to, and increasing the trade, business and

industries of the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount which is authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(f) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .7710 mills of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for a community recreation center, recreation personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities and operations; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(g) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .8729 mills of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for repairing or replacing public roads, sidewalks and trees in the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(h) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .4907 mills of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for the City's community transit program and capital improvements within the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(i) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .2452 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all ready and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year set out above, pursuant to Section 1 of Chapter VIII of the Charter of the City of Livonia, for the purpose of providing additional revenues for staff, maintenance, and; support costs for cultural and senior services in the City, including the Livonia Senior Center and Greenmead Historical Village, in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(j) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of 1.8823 mills, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year commencing December 1, 2022 and ending November 30, 2023, pursuant to the provisions of Act 298 of the Public Acts of 1917, for the purpose of establishing, operating, maintaining and administering the Municipal Garbage Collection System and/or plant for the collection and disposal of garbage and refuse in the City of Livonia; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(k) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of .4867 mills of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year commencing December 1, 2022 and ending November 30, 2023, for the purpose of defraying City expenses and liabilities for the collection and disposal activities required for curbside

recycling and yard waste composting programs; in addition to the amount authorized to be levied for general municipal purposes;

(l) The Council does hereby establish a tax levy of 2.0000 mills to be due and payable on July 1, 2023, of the Taxable Valuation of all real and personal property located within the Plymouth Road Development Authority, subject to taxation in the City of Livonia for the fiscal year commencing December 1, 2022 and ending November 30, 2023, pursuant to the provisions of Act 197 of the Public Acts of 1975, for the purpose of providing revenues for obligations and operations of the Plymouth Road Development Authority, in addition to the amount to be levied for general municipal purposes. This millage shall be effective provided that all residential properties are first removed from the Plymouth Road Development Authority district;

AND PROVIDED FURTHER, that the Wayne County Bureau of Taxation, City Assessor, City Treasurer and City Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary or incidental to the full performance of this resolution, and the City Clerk is hereby requested to immediately transmit copies of this resolution to each of the above offices.
