

**CITY OF LIVONIA – CITY COUNCIL
MINUTES OF STUDY MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 17, 2025**

Meeting was called to order at 8:40 p.m. by Councilmember Donovic. Present: Carrie Budzinski, Lynda Scheel, Scott Morgan, Laura Toy, Rob Donovic, Vice President Ptashnik, and President McCullough. Absent: None.
