

MINUTES OF THE TWO THOUSAND AND THIRTY FOURTH
REGULAR MEETING FEBRUARY 09, 2026

On February 09, 2026, the above meeting was held at the City Hall, 33000 Civic Center Drive, Livonia, Michigan, and was called to order by the President of the Council at 7:00 p.m. Councilmember McDonnell led the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll was called with the following result: Eileen McDonnell, Carrie Budzinski, Robin Persiconi, Martha Ptashnik, Patrick Brockway, Brandon McCullough, and Kayleigh Reid. Absent: None.

Elected and appointed officials present: Carter Fisher, City Attorney; Lori Miller, City Clerk; Sara Kasproicz, Program Supervisor of Council Office; and Todd Zilincik, City Engineer.

On a motion by Councilmember Budzinski, supported by Councilmember Brockway, and unanimously adopted, it was:

#50-26 RESOLVED, that the Minutes of the 2033rd Regular Meeting of the Council held January 26, 2026 are approved as presented.

During Audience Communication, Susan Chewy, Resident, expressed her opinion regarding I.C.E. and stated Livonia P.D. should work with the agency.

Paul Pearson, Nancy St., requested an update regarding the Mayor's stance on I.C.E.

Theo Gomulka, Harrison, spoke about his personal experience with law enforcement and gave his opinion on immigration.

Mike Martin, Trillium, recalled his experience with protesting in Livonia and wanted to remind everyone that regardless of opinions it is important not to view each other as enemies.

Karla Truxall, Jacquelyn Dr., informed Council of the Movin' with Moose event happening and the importance of mental health.

Christopher Martin, Resident, pointed out the poor cement quality by the

Civic Center Library and requested a different contractor in future projects.

#56-26 RESOLVED, that having considered a communication from the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, dated January 8, 2026, submitted pursuant to CR 323-25, adopted on October 20, 2025, which bears the signatures of the Director of Finance and the City Attorney, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, wherein a request is made for authorization to execute a Memorandum of Understanding for DIA Partners in Public Art Program for the installation of a community-driven mural at the Ben Celani play area, and to appoint a Councilmember as Council's Representative on the work committee, the Council does hereby authorize

the Mayor and City Clerk, for and on behalf of the City of Livonia, to execute the proposed memorandum of understanding in the manner and form herein submitted, subject to approval by the Department of Law, and to do all things necessary or incidental to the full performance of this resolution; FURTHER, the Council does hereby appoint Councilmember Carrie Budzinski as Council's Representative on the work committee and to participate in said committee on a continuing basis or until further order of this Council by council resolution.

#57-26 RESOLVED, that having considered the report and recommendation of the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation, dated January 9, 2026, which bears the signatures of the Director of Finance and the City Attorney, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, the Council does hereby authorize the purchase of a pool chemical automation system and granular chlorine at a unit price of \$3.55 per pound from Baruzzini Contracting LLC, 1281 S. Old US-23, Brighton, MI 48114, for a period of two (2) years, with the option for an additional year from the date of approval, in a total amount not to exceed \$285,760.00, which includes the installation of chemical feeders, automatic controllers, and removal of existing equipment, for use at the Jack E. Kirksey Recreation Center, Botsford and Clements Circle pools and Shelden splash pad, the same having been the sole bid received and meets all specifications. FURTHER, it is anticipated that the City will purchase approximately 15,600 pounds of chlorine per year at \$3.55 per pound, for a total annual cost of \$55,380.00. These expenditures will be funded from the following budget accounts:

accept the unit price bid of the second lowest bidder, Paradise Garden Landscaping, Inc., 26220 Groesbeck Hwy., Warren, MI 48089 to supply those species for the City's 2026 Right-Of-Way Tree Planting Program for an estimated total cost not to exceed \$178,154.00; and the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a contract, subject to approval as to form and substance by the Department of Law, for and on behalf of the City of Livonia with the aforesaid bidder(s) and to do all other things necessary or incidental to the full performance of this resolution.

#61-26 RESOLVED, that having considered the report and recommendation of the Assistant Director of Public Works, dated January 15, 2026, which bears the signatures of the Director of Public Works, the Director of Finance and the City Attorney, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, the Council does hereby accept the bid of Nationwide Construction Group, 69941 Lowes Plank Rd., Richmond, MI 48062, for performing all work required in connection with the removal and replacement of two (2) existing backstops and four (4) dugout benches at the Ford Field Ball Diamond Complex, diamonds #3 and #6, in an amount not to exceed \$30,440.00, the same having been the lowest bid received and meets all specifications; FURTHER, the Council does hereby authorize an expenditure in an amount not to exceed \$30,440.00 from funds budgeted in Account No: 401-000-974-000 for this purpose; and the Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized, for and on behalf of the City of Livonia, to execute a contract with the aforesaid bidder and to do all other things necessary or incidental to the full performance of this resolution.

#62-26 RESOLVED, that having considered the report and recommendation of the Superintendent of Public Works, dated January 15, 2026, which bears the signatures of the Director of Public Works and the Director of Finance, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, the Council does hereby authorize the Mayor and City Clerk to execute a one-year contract from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026, with the option to extend for three (3) additional two-year extensions, with a 3% cap increase in pricing for each 2-year extension, with Eganix, Inc., 1091 Centre Road, Suite 120, Auburn Hills, MI 48326, for providing all materials, labor, and equipment necessary to perform fats, oils and grease ("FOG") prevention treatment in areas of the City's sewer system that are known to be susceptible to FOG build up, for an annual amount not to exceed \$80,000.00; FURTHER, the Council does hereby authorize an expenditure in an amount not to exceed \$80,000.00 from funds budgeted in Account No. 592-559-818-050 (Fat, Oil & Grease Prevention) for this purpose. In addition, the Council does hereby authorize the Department of Public Works to take advantage of the three (3) 2-year extensions, with a 3% cap increase per extension, which covers the City through 2032 (Extension 1 FY 2027-2028, Extension 2 FY 2029-2030, and Extension 3 FY 2031-2032), for an annual amount not to exceed \$80,000.00; FURTHER, the Council does hereby authorize such action without competitive bidding for the reasons indicated in the aforesaid communication, and such action is

#64-26 RESOLVED, that having considered the report and recommendation of the Assistant Director of Public Works, dated January 15, 2026, which bears the signatures of the Director of Public Works and the Director of Finance, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, wherein a request is made to increase the amount of rock salt purchased for ice control from 2,625 tons to 2,800 tons annually and authorize an annual budget increase of \$75,000.00 for the next four (4) years (2026, 2027, 2028 and 2029), the Council does hereby authorize the purchase of 100% of the City's requirement of rock salt used for ice control from Detroit Salt, 12841 Sanders Street, Detroit, MI 48217, and increases the amount of rock salt to be purchased for years 2026 thru 2029 to 2,800 tons annually, at the unit prices not to exceed \$62.59 per ton for the 2025-2026 season; \$64.47 per ton for 2026-2027; \$66.41 per ton for 2027-2028; and

The Council does hereby authorize the City Engineer acting as the Street Administrator to apply to the Michigan Department of Transportation for the

inclusion of said streets in the City's local street system for the purpose of computing the City's share of Act 51 revenues.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the street additions are approved public streets and are open for public purposes; and FURTHER, that said street additions are accepted into the City's local street system and are located within a right-of-way under the control of the City of Livonia and that said streets additions were open to the public as of December 31, 2025.

RESOLVED, that having considered a communication from the Department of Public Works, dated January 15, 2026, approved for submission by the Mayor, and which bears the signature of the Director of Finance and the City Attorney, concerning decertification in the local street system, for Act 51 revenue computation purposes, of the following streets for a total decertification length of 1,511 linear feet:

Mason Avenue (Decertification)

Length: -120.0 L.F.

Termini: Knolson Avenue to 120' West of Knolson Avenue

Shadyside Avenue (Decertification)

Length: -140.0 L.F.

Christopher Martin, Resident, spoke regarding Item 3 about his personal experiences and the correct process of appointing a member to the board.

On a motion by Councilmember Budzinski, supported by Councilmember Ptashnik, and unanimously adopted, it was:

#66-26 RESOLVED, that having considered the request of Councilmember Brandon McCullough at the Study Meeting held January 26, 2026, regarding the subject matter of exterior lighting and luminosity from businesses, the Council does hereby refer this item to the Law and Education Committee for its report and recommendation.

Jerry Karasinski, Bainbridge Ave., noted an urgent care that opened on Seven Mile Road near his home that has very bright lights.

Eric Fitzpatrick, Rosedale Gardens, stated the Plymouth Road street lights do not comply with Livonia's policies, they should be retrofitted, and requested a review of the ordinance.

On a motion by Councilmember McCullough, supported by Councilmember Persiconi, and unanimously adopted, it was:

#67-26 RESOLVED, that having considered a communication from the City Engineer, dated January 22, 2026, which bears the signatures of the Assistant Director of Public Works and the City Attorney, and is approved for submission by the Mayor, the Council does hereby determine as follows:

WHEREAS, the City of Livonia (hereinafter the "Community") periodically applies to the County of Wayne Department of Public Services, Engineering Division Permit Office (hereinafter the "County") for permits to conduct emergency repairs, annual maintenance work, and for other purposes on local and County roads located entirely within the boundaries of the Community, as needed from time to time to maintain the roads in a condition reasonably safe and convenient for public travel;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Act 51 of 1951, being MCL 247.651 et seq., the County permits and regulates such activities noted above and related temporary road closures;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, in consideration of the County granting such permit (hereinafter the "Permit"), the Community agrees and resolves that:

Any work performed for the Community by a contractor or subcontractor will be solely as a contractor for the Community and not as a contractor or agent of the County. Any claims by any contractor or subcontractor will be the sole responsibility of the Community. The County shall not be subject

to any obligations or liabilities by vendors and contractors of the Community, or their subcontractors.

The Community shall take no unlawful action or conduct, which arises either directly or indirectly out of its obligations, responsibilities, and duties under the Permit which results in claims being asserted against or judgment being imposed against the County, and all officers, agents and employees thereof pursuant to a maintenance contract. In the event that same occurs, for the purposes of the Permit, it will be considered a breach of the Permit thereby giving the County a right to seek and obtain any necessary relief or remedy, including, but not by way of limitation, a judgment for money damages.

With respect to any activities authorized by Permit, when the Community requires insurance on its own or its contractor's behalf, it shall also require that such policy include as named insured the County of Wayne and all officers, agents and employees thereof.

The incorporation by the County of this Resolution as part of a permit does not prevent the County from requiring additional performance security or insurance before issuance of a Permit.

This Resolution stipulates that the requesting Community shall, at no expense to Wayne County, provide necessary police supervision, establish detours and post all necessary signs and other traffic control devices in accordance with the Michigan Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

This Resolution stipulates that the requesting Community shall assume full responsibility for the cost of repairing damage done to the County road during the period of road closure or partial closure.

This Resolution shall continue in force from the date of execution until cancelled by the Community or the County with no less than thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. It will not be cancelled or otherwise terminated by the Community with regard to any Permit which has already been issued or activity which has already been undertaken.

The Community stipulates that it agrees to the terms of the County of Wayne permit at the time a permit is signed by the Community's authorized representative.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the following individual(s) is/are authorized in their official Capacity as the Community's authorized representative to sign and so bind the Community to the provisions of any and all permits applied for to the County of Wayne, Department of Public Services Engineering Division Permit Office for necessary permits from time to time to work within County road right-of-way or local roads on behalf of the Community:
